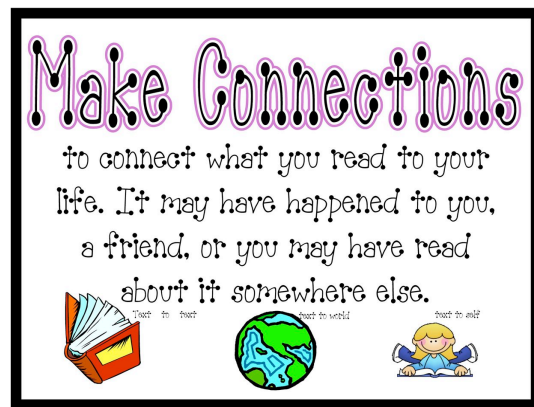


## Reading Comprehension Game....Making Connections

Directions

- You only need to tell about the connection you make.

- Browse through the 3 stories above and make at least 1-2 connections per story.
- Record your information on a piece of scratch paper.

**Choose a spokesperson for each team**

Each opposing team will be able to consult its spokesperson before giving an answer.

Each time a team correctly names the story that inspired the connection, will be awarded one point.
